Work Package 4 Managing Internationalisation

The intention of this Work Package is to assist colleagues in considering the adequacy and effectiveness of their international strategy, activities and operations at their institutions and, with the help of discussions with fellow participants and the trainer, to map out areas of improvement and potential further directions for development. This will occur through programme specific activities carried out in the period February-November 2014.

Workshop 2: Institutional Visit - organisation and implementation of internationalisation

The focus of workshop 2 will be on exploring how internationalisation is understood and enacted in two Italian Universities. The main focus will be at the host and partner institution Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore but there will also be an opportunity to interact with the Politecnico Milano where Engineering and Architecture are offered.

The first day of the workshop will focus on managing internationalisation at UCSC from the point of view of the International Office through the experiences of the Managers responsible for incoming and outgoing mobility and through a visit to the various departments within the Office. The Rector's Delegate for Internationalisation will share his thoughts on strategic development at the University.

The second day will be divided into two parts. The morning session will look at the links between internationalisation and research and how research might be further enhanced through an articulated strategy for internationalisation. The afternoon session will present some innovative international activities and examples of best practice that are being carried out at UCSC.

The third day of the workshop will start with a visit to the Politecnico to learn about their current approach to internationalisation with a focus on International Office Management and Internationalising the Curriculum. The afternoon session will reflect on what has been learnt during the three days and each institution will draw up an action plan based on the key outcomes for its specific context that will further integrate the strategic plan for internationalisation.

Summary: 2nd Workshop on Internationalization of the Curriculum:

The 2nd workshop on internationalization of the curriculum took place at Beit Berl College on January 28-30.

Prof. Tamar Ariav, the President of Beit Berl College welcomed the participants with a review of the activities that are undertaken in the college and a description of its uniqueness as a teacher education institution for Arab and Jewish communities.



Dr. Amira Meir and the team at Beit Berl College hosted the participants from the Israeli Colleges, the guests from Bologna Training Center Ben-Gurion University and the representatives from the Israeli National Tempus Office.

The workshop started with a brief description by a representative of each one of the colleges. The reviews, in which the specific IoC activities in each college were presented, were enlightening and educating. Each one of the presentations yielded discussion and the participants provided insights and advises.

The second day of the workshop started with a presentation by Prof. Helena Desivilya who shared with us reflections and issues of IoC in YVC College. She presented the case study of research/project group on culture sensitive-competent teaching and learning.

Dr. Sheila Trahar presented the process of Internationalising the Curriculum in specific disciplines, with special attention to the field of technology and engineering. Summary: 1st Managing Internationalisation: IRO Training Workshop:

The 1st IRO (International Relations Office) Training workshop took place at Sapir Academic College on February 03-05.

Prof. Omri Yadlin, the nominated President of Sapir Academic College welcomed the participants with an interesting story about implementing internationalization by College students in Ethiopia.

The team at Sapir, Dr. Hanan Maoz, Ms. Amit Marantz-Gal, and Mr. Naor Naftali hosted the participants from the Israeli Colleges, the partners from PHK and WUT, the guests from Bologna Training Center Ben-Gurion University and the representatives from the Israeli National Tempus Office.

Dr. Fiona Hunter started the workshop by asking each college to prepare a list of three major issues that they think are the most important for this process. Several issues were discussed and used to structure the framework of the workshop.

Mr. Naor Naftali drew a map of Israel and each College representative was asked to draw the weather in his/her college with regard to internationalisation. Most of the colleges drew a mix of sunny and cloudy weather representing a supportive environment by the high level management/President but on the other hand uncertainty how to implement these concepts in practice.



The next session was aimed at discussing guidelines for strategic planning, focusing on positioning, defining, and having a plan that indicates what action items are required, when and on what budget.

The second and third days were dedicated to peer consulting sessions. The participants were divided into small groups. Using a strict schedule that includes: an introduction by the case owner to the group, questioning

by the peers, exchange of ideas by peers who discuss the case and try to develop solutions, consulting by the peers to the case owner, and feedback by the case owner.



The workshop was summarized by identifying weaknesses and strengths in the current strategic plans, and by structuring directions to implementation by developing action plans.

We would like to thank Dr. Fiona Hunter for a productive and educating workshop, Prof. Omri Yadlin, the President of Sapir Academic College, Dr.

Hanan Maoz, and Ms. Amit Marantz-Gal, the Tempus IRIS team at Sapir Academic College.

"Erasmus+ entered into force on 1 January 2014. It covers the different education sectors ranging from school to adult education as well as youth non-formal learning. As such, the new programme offers more opportunities for higher education to work with partners in the other education and youth sectors.



Its budget of €14.7 billion (US\$20 billion) plus €1.68 billion for international actions in the area of higher education – referring to actions involving individuals and institutions from non-European Union countries – represents a rise of over 40% compared with the previous programmes.

Almost half of it will be devoted to higher education and will allow for significantly increased opportunities for students, academics, higher education institutions, enterprises and other academic and non-academic players. A few figures show the magnitude of the change:

- Erasmus+ will allow two million students to study and train abroad in the next seven years, compared to a total of three million students in the previous 26 years.
- Around 150 'knowledge alliances', bringing together higher education institutions and enterprises with a view to fostering innovation, will be established, thus scaling up the current pilot project that funded a limited number per year in 2011-13.
- More than 25,000 students will receive full scholarships for high-level joint masters degrees as compared to 16,000 in the past 10 years.
- 200,000 masters students will benefit from the new loan guarantee scheme.
- 1,000 projects involving universities from other parts of the world will be funded to reinforce their capacities."
